Shelter openings may vary with each emergency. Stay tuned to local media for a listing of which shelters will be opened for an event. Do not go to the shelter until local officials announce through the media that the shelter is open. Shelter openings will differ by size and intensity of a disaster.

 Category 3 - Evacuate purple, blue and green areas and all manufactured home residents	111 to 130	Up to 13'
 Category 4/5 - Evacuate purple, blue, green and yellow areas and all manufactured homes	131 and Over	Up to 19'+

— Surge values vary considerably depending on coastal configurations, forward speed direction of the hurricane, tides, and wave action.

Evacuation plan

The colored areas on this map are vulnerable to storm surge. Storm surge is salt water flooding which rushes over coastal areas near where the eye of the hurricane strikes, destroying homes and businesses in its path. Nine out of 10 hurricane-related deaths are caused by storm surge and inland flooding.

Hurricanes are categorized on a scale of one to five depending on the strength of the winds. Storm surge can reach 5-6 feet above sea level in a Category 1 hurricane to more than 19 feet above sea level in a Category 5 hurricane. Depending on the track and strength of a threatening hurricane, local officials may order one of five evacuation levels.

If you live in a mobile home or recreational vehicle, you must evacuate no matter which zone you live in. These structures are extremely vulnerable to hurricane winds.

Listen to local radio or TV for announcements of shelter openings. Not every shelter will be open.

Dear Sarasota County Residents and Visitors:

As we start the current hurricane season, each of us must evaluate our own hurricane action plan. Is your family and/or business prepared with a plan for the current hurricane season? Act now! This may be your last opportunity to prepare your family.

The onslaught of Hurricane Andrew in August 1992 left a path of destruction and despair unlike any disaster in the history of our nation. It was a window of opportunity for emergency managers to try to convince people living in and visiting this state, that we are subject to occasional visits by these killer storms, such as 1998 Hurricane Georges.

Please use this document as it was intended: to guide you through the process of developing a family disaster plan. Talk it over with neighbors and friends; come up with a neighborhood response plan. Make sure all members of your family know how to use this booklet, and make its contents work for you. Develop a plan of action now. Don't wait until the next storm threatens our area.

Emergency Management is not one individual or Government office, it is a concept whereby all members of a community work together to prepare for, respond to, recover from, and mitigate the effects of disaster. Only by pulling together will we, as a community, be able to survive and recover when our town comes to meet disaster head on.
